### Adult Support and Protection



If someone is worried about your safety, it could start something called an Adult Support and Protection (ASP) process.



Adult Support and Protection (ASP) is a law which tries to stop people from being harmed.



Social workers will speak to you and others to check if you feel unsafe or need some support to keep you safe.



The other people the social workers may speak to could be family, friends, carers or support workers.



You can have support during the Adult Support and Protection process from Independent Advocacy.



Independent advocacy is separate from organisations that provide other types of support like Social Work or the Health Service.

### An independent advocate can do this by



- explaining what adult support and protection means for you
- helping you to understand why people are worried about you
- going over what might be discussed at meetings
- going with you to your meetings

- supporting you to have your say in meetings
- helping you to think about how any decisions might affect you
